

Feedstim XP – Simply irresistible

Just some feedback for you,

I fished a match yesterday at Cider Farm Lakes and won overall with 133lb of carp (53 fish) all on corn or 8ml cubed meat flavoured with the Feedstim XP, more than trebled the weight of the people either side of me, so am well impressed.

I'm now so confident going into this weekend's match, I don't care which peg I draw, and confidence in the bait is half the battle; once they settled on the baited they never left!

Clive tells us:

I fish regular open matches on my local commercial fisheries; one such is Cider Farm Fishery near Weston-Super-Mare.

I won the lake (Dabinett) competition this weekend with a total weight in the 6 hour match of 133lb 13oz.

By including liquid Feedstim XP into my bait gives me total confidence during my matches. This match proved to me the pulling power of Feedstim XP with commercial carp when others around me struggled for bites.

My 6 hour winning weight consisted of 52 match sized carp between 2 and 4lb each, all caught on the pole down the left hand margin at about 5 metres in approx 20" of water- this is where I could comfortably feed the swim by hand for the duration of the match. My feed consisted of hemp, corn and 6ml Cubed luncheon meat with 8ml cubes on a size 12 Drennan wide gape carp hook tied to 0.18mm Stroft and a small handmade float.

My preparation with the luncheon meat starts the previous week using a commercially available meat cutter (I use Tilley cutters.) I cut 6 tins into 6ml cubes for my main feed and 4 tins into slightly larger 8ml cubes for the hook. Into a large freezer bag I place 1 capful of Feedstim XP per tin of meat before adding the cubes. I then blow air into the bag and twist before shaking until all the particles have been covered in the Feedstim XP. I then remove the air, tie up the bag and freeze. I remove the meat from the freezer the following day to defrost which allows the Feedstim liquid to be drawn into the meat.



I repeat this freezing and defrosting routine each day for a week prior to a match as the process actually softens the texture of the bait which I believe increases its attraction and leakage properties. It also increases my hooked fish to bites ratio. Note; I am not using a hair rig but am hooking the bait directly. I also take my tins of corn, rinse them, drain them and bag them up with the addition of Feedstim XP.

My third keep net of fish!

I am positive the addition of this liquid to my baits recently has improved my catches. As a match angler it gives me great confidence in my baits and a certain edge over fellow anglers on my local circuit, until now my secret is out!

Enjoying my fishing again!
