



## Meteor Session Pack- what more can you want?

### What more can you want?

CC Moore have recently developed a ready to use Session Pack Bucket deal which contains of a tub of air ball pop ups, 125ml of bait dip, 3kg of matching pellets and 1kg of shelf life boilies making it the perfect bait choice for a successful session – at any time of year!

These session packs have been developed for all baits in the CC Moore boilie range so include Live System, N-Gage XP, Odyssey xxx and Meteor which is the bait I am going to be focusing on in this review.

Meteor is a bait which is extremely rich in liver, one of the best carp attractors of all time, and contains high levels of meat proteins and the legendary Haith's Robin Red. It also contains a few added special 'touches' which really make it something extra special and a great year round bait that once established will totally dominate a water!



There are many different ways to put this session pack to good use but one of my favourite tactics has to be to glug my pellets and allow the dip to soak in before using them. As I am only a short session angler I want as much pulling power as possible to draw the fish into and around my hook bait.

I glug my pellets for a week before I go so that when I turn up at the lake the pellets have drawn in all the powerful attractors to make your pellets just that extra bit special, giving them more pulling power than standard pellets being used by other anglers.

Whether you put the pellets into your spod mix or your bag mix, this will definitely pull cruising fish down from the upper layers of water so they drop onto your baited patch.

There are 50 air ball pop ups that come with the session pack and can be used in many different ways such as on a snowman rig, a KD rig or in my opinion the best of the lot, the CHOD RIG.

These superb air ball pop ups are colour-matched, buoyant enough to be stood up on that CHOD RIG for a long period of time and also durable enough to withstand the unwanted attraction of nuisance fish, bringing them up to the usual high level of quality you come to expect with CC Moore products.

Another little edge you could use is to pour a bit of the liquid bait dip over the pop ups to give them an extra boost of attraction. These excellent buoyant baits can also be easily trimmed into any shape of size you require- making them far more effective for attracting large, wary fish.



The meteor boilie really is a high quality bait which has a low oil content, making it a very versatile bait which can be fished all year round which is a massive boost for any carp angler.

Meteor is also highly digestible making it just as good in winter as it is in summer as it is quickly digested by Carp meaning that once they eat it, they will just eat 'MOORE' and 'MOORE'. There is an impressive cross section of natural extracts added to Meteor so it is no surprise that this mix has become so successful both in the UK and abroad.

Meteor is not only packed full of soluble attractors which drive fish into a feeding frenzy in even the toughest conditions but it also has a nice firm skin which means it is quite durable and suitable for use within a throwing stick.

Personally, I like putting out a lot of boilie with a throwing stick onto a nice silt spot and fishing a choddy as shown in the picture above, these tactics have caught me many big, clever English fish over the last few months.



If you seriously want to increase the number of fish you put on the bank and are looking for a great year-round bait to give you A SERIOUS EDGE over other anglers then I suggest you try this session pack as soon as possible.

Since I have been with CC Moore this bait has seemed to be one of most successful in their awesome range.

This is a devastating session pack!

I hope some of the information and tips will put you a few extra fish on the bank. See for yourself how devastating this Meteor Session Pack can be on your water,

Use 'Moore' bait and I can assure you you'll catch 'Moore' fish.
